




WISDOM HIGH

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

THE WORLD OF MATHS - NURSERY

Young children are often eager to learn new skills and concepts. Introducing math through handson activities is most effective, as they learn best by doing. Nursery students had a blast learning how to write and recognize these numbers through fun games and activities. For number 1, little toddlers made the moon with the help of foil paper, and for number 2, they did finger painting on the flashcard of number 2.



Students also delved into the world of shapes, specifically the circle and triangle. The children enjoyed identifying these shapes in their environment and creating their own circle and triangle artwork. They learned about the attributes of each shape and how they are different from one another.









The children had a great time comparing objects of different sizes and sorting them into big and small categories. This helped them develop their understanding of size relationships and spatial awareness.

Using ice cream sticks and pencils to make bundles introduced the concept of grouping and counting in a hands-on, visual manner.




Number Domino



















MATHEMATIA

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
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



Fun-filled and interactive hands-on activities were conducted in Class III. Students gained experience and enjoyed all the activities a lot.






























EVS CLASS IV
